
Fun Facts about Longwood

English Language Learning Program

Longwood Elementary Schools values the linguistic and cultural diversity that our students bring to our school. In accordance to the District 204 ELL Program, Longwood offers:

English as a Second Language (ESL): The goals of the ESL program are: 1) To develop English skills while learning grade appropriate academic content, 2) To develop academic English language proficiency to assist students in meeting Illinois Learning Standards as well as the Illinois English Language Proficiency Standards. 3) ESL instruction focuses on the development of both social and academic language in all four language domains: Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing in English.

Bilingual Education: At Longwood we currently have a Transitional Bilingual Program (TBE) for qualifying Spanish speaking students.

The goals of the Transitional Bilingual Program are: 1) To develop English skills while learning grade appropriate academic content, 2) To develop academic English language proficiency to assist students in meeting Illinois Learning Standards as well as Illinois English Language Proficiency Standards and 3) to promote bilingualism and biliteracy. The students in the Bilingual Program receive ESL instruction as well as native literacy instruction and/or native language support.

Project Arrow Program (PA) and Accelerated Math Program

These two programs address the needs of those students who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement as well as show potential beyond that of their age level peers. At the elementary level, both programs are offered to students in third grade through fifth grade. These programs allow interaction with peers of similar ability and include a variety of services ranging from classroom enrichment to differentiated and/or accelerated curriculum for higher grade levels. In order to be part of these programs, the school considers multiple academic measures as well as teacher recommendation.

Project Arrow is the 204 School District gifted program offered to students who consistently excel or show the potential to consistently excel in general intellectual ability and/or specific academic aptitude or talent. The identification process for the Project Arrow program occurs on an annual basis and the program is for students in grades 3-5.

Accelerated Math is a separate program from Project Arrow. A student in the Accelerated Math Program may or may not be part of Project Arrow depending on the academic needs of the student. The Program is designed to begin in 3rd grade and to continue through high school. This program is for students who demonstrate a strong knowledge in mathematical problem solving and math computation. Usually, students learn math that is accelerated one grade level. The identification process occurs at the end of second grade and students can be tested annually, if needed.

LONGWOOD GLOSSARY

Arrival- Students should between 8:50 AM- 9:00 AM on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. On Wednesdays they should arrive between 9:00 AM- 9:10 AM. If a student is having breakfast at school, they need to arrive at 8:50 AM sharp and go to the cafeteria (9:00 AM on Wednesdays).

Art Smock - Please send an art smock in a ziploc bag with your child's name on it and it will stay in your child's locker. It can be an oversized t-shirt or old t-shirt.

Backpack Mail - Flyers from the school, PTA and other important information your child brings home will in their take home folders for your review. Please check these every night. Items coming directly from the office will be on purple paper- so you know they are very important!

Common Core Curriculum - This is an educational initiative in the United States that dictates what K-12 students should know in English language arts and mathematics at the end of each grade. The standards were created to ensure that all students graduate from high school with the skills and knowledge necessary to succeed in college, career, and life, regardless of where they live.

Dismissal-

- ☞ Bus riders, Car riders and day care riders are dismissed to locations at 3:30 PM
- ☞ Walkers are dismissed at 3:35 PM

Google Sites – Many teachers have Google sites where they communicate with parents about what is occurring in their classroom. You can find this site by going to the Longwood Home Page, clicking on Faculty and Staff and clicking on the hyperlink for your child's teacher or teachers.

Early dismissal - Parents must notify the office of any daily changes (via note or phone call) PRIOR to 3:00 pm. No students will be dismissed early between 3:00pm and 3:35pm. If we do not hear from a parent, we will not accept a child's word for a change in routine.

Field Day - Dress your child in comfortable and weather appropriate clothing, including shoes. Have your child bring a water bottle they can refill during the school day. This will be at the end of the school year!

Genius Hour- Genius Hour is built into the schedule for grades 1-5, three days a week. It is a time for students to practice reading, writing, researching and synthesizing skills while exploring independent interests and projects.

Gym shoes - Your child needs to bring a pair of gym shoes on the days he/she has PE. They can leave an extra pair in their lockers or just wear them to school.

Hot lunch -Under the Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 and the National School Lunch Program, the required components of a "meal" include fluid milk, meat/meat alternate, two different fruits and/or vegetables, and breads/grains. On behalf of the District, Aramark serves all meals based on the USDA Healthier Choice Guidelines. Cost of the Lunch/Breakfast meal is \$2.55.

Take Home Folder - A folder your child uses every day to take important paperwork home to share with you. You can also use this folder to send any notes or other paperwork back to school to be shared with the teacher.

Late Start Wednesdays - Every Wednesday, school starts at 9:15am (10 minutes later than normal). This provides additional training time for our teachers.

Lost and Found - There is an area for lost and found items, located outside the staff bathrooms.. Make sure you label your child's coats, snow pants, etc.

Maker Space- This is an area in our library where students can create! It is called the Longwood Creation Station. Students can go with their class or in small groups. Here, students can build, code, design and more.

MPR - Multi-purpose room, where the students eat lunch.

Parent-Student Handbook- Please visit the website and click on the Parent-Student Handbook tab on the left side. This gives a lot of important information about Longwood policies and procedures.

School Drop Off – M-T-TH-F doors open at 8:50 AM every day. Every Wednesday doors open at 9:00. If your child arrives earlier, they will have to wait outside.

Sick Days - Make sure to call the attendance hotline Phone: 630.428.6789 Extension 3 and leave a message with your kid's name, classroom information and a short explanation of his/her sickness.

Specials – Longwood specials include Art, Music, and PE (Physical Education). Students have opportunities to attend the LMC and our Maker Space, as well.

Spirit Assembly- Here at Longwood, we recognize "Longwood Leaders" for character traits each month at an assembly. If your child is being recognized, you will be invited by their class teacher.

Tardiness – Students are expected to be in class, ready to learn, at 9:05 AM (9:15 AM on Wednesdays), or they are considered tardy. They have to go to the main office (or right outside), sign in, specify if they would need or not hot lunch that day and get a Tardy Pass to give to their teachers. Students are on time if they are sitting in their desks when the starting bell of the day rings and tardy if they are not in their assigned seats.
